PART I: ACCESS TO INFORMATION FROM WRITTEN TEXTS (70 points)

Read the book review below and then answer questions 1-7.

ROOMS WITH CLUES

Have you ever wondered what your room says about you? Or perhaps you would like to be able to find out about a colleague's personality just by looking at his desk? If so, *Snoop* is for you. In this charming and well-written book, psychologist Sam Gosling explains how much we can all learn about people from their personal surroundings.

- 5 When psychologists want to find out about people's personalities, they usually ask them to fill in a standard written questionnaire. But according to Gosling, there is another way to do it, which is both quicker and simpler. All you have to do, he says, is "snoop" – look for clues in the places where people live or work. His conclusion is based on numerous studies that showed how our personalities are expressed in our
- 10 living and working spaces.

In one study, Gosling's team looked at the bedrooms of college students and rated various features: How clean was the room? What kind of furniture did it have? How many photographs were displayed? The researchers also gave the participants the standard personality test. Then they compared the results of that test with what they

15 had observed in the rooms. In some cases, they were surprised by what they found. For example, they expected friendly students to paint their rooms in warm colors, but they discovered that the color of the walls didn't say much about friendliness. A better indication was the furniture: friendly students were much more likely to have comfortable furniture than unfriendly ones.

- 20 By pointing out such clues to personality, *Snoop* can help you get a much better understanding of the people around you. But even if you don't make practical use of the information, you should definitely read the book because it focuses on a topic that all of us find exciting: ourselves.
