PART I: ACCESS TO INFORMATION FROM WRITTEN TEXTS (60 points)

Read the book review below and then answer questions 1-6.

UNDERSTANDING YOUR PET

The number of pet owners among us has increased dramatically in recent years. Since research has repeatedly shown the beneficial effects of owning a pet, this may mean there are a whole lot of happier, healthier people out there. But what about the health and happiness of the animals? A team of veterinarians at the University of Utah, concerned that many of us are ignorant of our pets' needs, has just published *Animal Companions* — a manual designed to teach us how to care for every aspect of our pets' lives.

One chapter in the book deals with the question of maintaining your pet's health. In addition to the expected lists of animal ailments, it offers advice about how to recognize signs of poor health. This is especially important if you own an exotic pet, such as an iguana or an African parrot, since people are less likely to seek medical treatment for such animals. As the writers explain, these creatures come from the wild, where sick animals are often the ones that get eaten by predators, so any obvious indication of disease could cost them their lives. Consequently, even when they are taken out of their natural environment, it is extremely difficult to tell from their behavior that they are ill.

This is just one example of the many intriguing insights you can find in the book.

The last chapter, which is devoted to discipline, will undoubtedly be of great interest to numerous pet owners. It is often assumed that punishment is the best way to get pets to behave properly but, as the book explains, that is a misconception. A dog barking continuously, for example, may be suffering from stress; since punishment increases stress, it is likely to make the problem worse. This does not mean punishment has no role in training a pet, as long as it is done right: in most cases, a firm word is all that's needed. But according to the authors, rewarding good behavior is even more effective.

Although much of the information in *Animal Companions* is quite technical, the book is written in a clear and often entertaining style. Moreover, it contains quite a few surprising facts. How many people know that dog food can be dangerous for cats, or that fish have a better memory than is generally believed? In short, the book provides fascinating reading whether or not you own a pet. And if you do, it may go a long way to improving your animal's quality of life.
